Satan lies in wait with snares and deceptions. God has given us a guide in the person of His Son, who says, "I am the light of the world: He that followeth Me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life." (John 8:12)

Our life then is a journey of the soul (the inner self, mental and spiritual). If we see life in terms of the development of the soul, then all of life's experiences become for us instruments for the perfection of the soul. But if we ignore the soul and attempt to achieve happiness through making a better life for ourselves on the earth, then we will have missed the whole meaning of life.
